[1] I refer to counsels' joint memorandum of 11 August 2022.

[2] At paragraph 8, counsel requested departures from r 7.39 of the High Court Rules and a variation to the direction issued on 4 August 2022, that:

- (a) a 20-page limit for the synopses of Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua and the respondents, and any submissions made by interested parties that include the Attorney-General; and
- (b) Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua file and serve a synopsis of argument on or before **4 October 2022**;
- (c) Ngā Hapū o Tangaroa and any other interested party, should any seek and be granted leave to participate, in support of the strike-out applications to file any submissions on or before **4 October 2022**;
- (d) the respondents file and serve a synopsis of argument on or before **13 October 2022**; and
- (e) the Attorney-General file and serve any submissions on or before **20 October 2022**.
