MINUTE (NO 3) OF CHURCHMAN J

- [1] In a minute dated 14 September 2022, I directed the registrar to investigate the possibility of allocating an eight-week hearing for the Group N Stage 1(b) hearing, on the next available date after 7 October 2024. I noted also that if the potentially affected South Island applicants chose not to participate in the Stage 1(b) hearing, the hearing length would be able to be substantially reduced.
- [2] I have now been informed by the Registrar that an eight-week period is available from 7 October 2024 to 29 November 2024. It follows that a timetable for both the Stage 1(a) and Stage 1(b) hearings can be settled. I confirm the following timetable for each hearing:
