Northland at Alert Level 3, Auckland at Alert Level 4: Arrangements for courts

Alert levels

The Government announced yesterday that Northland would join the rest of the country – with the exception of Auckland – at Alert Level 3 at 11.59pm on Thursday 2 September. The Auckland region remains at Alert Level 4 until at least Monday 13 September.

Cabinet is next reviewing alert levels for areas south of the Auckland boundary on Monday 6 September. Further guidance on court arrangements will be issued following any changes to the alert levels.

No one should cross the Alert Level 4 border to attend court

The Chief Justice confirms that defendants (including those in custody), prosecutors, counsel and witnesses are not required and not expected to travel out of or into Auckland to attend an in-person hearing while Auckland remains at a higher alert level than the rest of the country.

Jury trials

In the interests of health and safety, no **new** jury trials will begin during Alert Level 3 or 4 in the District Court or the High Court.

Jurors who are summoned to attend court on a date when the court is at either Alert Level 3 or 4 are excused from attending. Jury trials that were underway before the lockdown remain adjourned and trial judges will consult and make decisions on a case-by-case basis.

It is anticipated that jury trials will begin again at Alert Level 2. Further guidance about jury trials will be issued promptly following any Government announcement on a move to Alert Level 2. Guidance will include details of the health and safety measures courts will be adopting to ensure jury trials are conducted safely.

Media attendance at court

In the interests of health and safety, media are asked not to attend court in person during Alert Levels 3 and 4 and instead to attend by remote viewing. See the Courts of New Zealand website

for information on how to arrange this. If remote viewing is not available, please contact the registry concerned.

Further advice for media on attending court in person at Alert Level 2 will be issued promptly after any Government announcement about a move down in alert levels.
