MINUTE (NO. 9) OF CHURCHMAN J

[1] By minute of 11 June 2020,¹ the Court amended the timetable in relation to the hearing of this priority application.

[2] The cross-applicants were directed to file and serve their evidence no later than 11 August 2020.

[3] By memorandum of 31 July 2020, counsel for Ngai Tahu o Mōhaka Waikare (CIV-2017-485-235), a cross-applicant in this matter, applied for an extension of time for the filing of the evidence of one of its witnesses.

[4] That witness was Dr Paul Husbands.

[5] The reasons advanced in respect of the request for an extension for this witness related to difficulties accessing Archives New Zealand and the Alexander Turnbull Library to carry out research and the fact that Dr Husbands had been engaged at short notice due to the previous historian being unable to complete the brief.

[6] In the circumstances, given these developments, the two-week extension sought is appropriate. Accordingly, an extension of time is granted to Ngai Tahu o Mōhaka Waikare for Dr Husbands' evidence to be filed and served no later than 25 August 2020.

[7] No adjustment to the timetable in respect of any other parties is required.
