# **MACA Aotea Harbour Hearing Overview**

### 1. Hearing Area

The Aotea Harbour Hearing was proposed by Ngāti Te Wehi and allocated by Churchman J in October 2022. The hearing will deal with MACA application areas within Aotea Harbour.

The hearing boundary is illustrated on the map from <u>Kōrero Takutai</u> below. The hearing boundary across the harbour mouth has been defined by Ngāti Whakamarurangi's boundary (MAC-01-04-010)<sup>2</sup>. This is shown by a purple line. Ngāti Te Wehi's application area is shown by the light blue line.

#### 2. Dates and venue

The Stage 1 (CMT) hearing took place over two weeks starting 17 June 2024 at Hamilton High Court. Andrew J's reserved CMT decision<sup>4</sup> was issued on 20 November 2024.

A Stage 2 hearing to determine Wahi Tapu and final orders was scheduled for 17 November 2025. Following the CMT Amendment Act passing, the CMT decision is nullified<sup>5</sup>. On 5 November, Andrew J vacated the Stage Two hearing and directed submissions from parties regarding next steps<sup>6</sup>.
