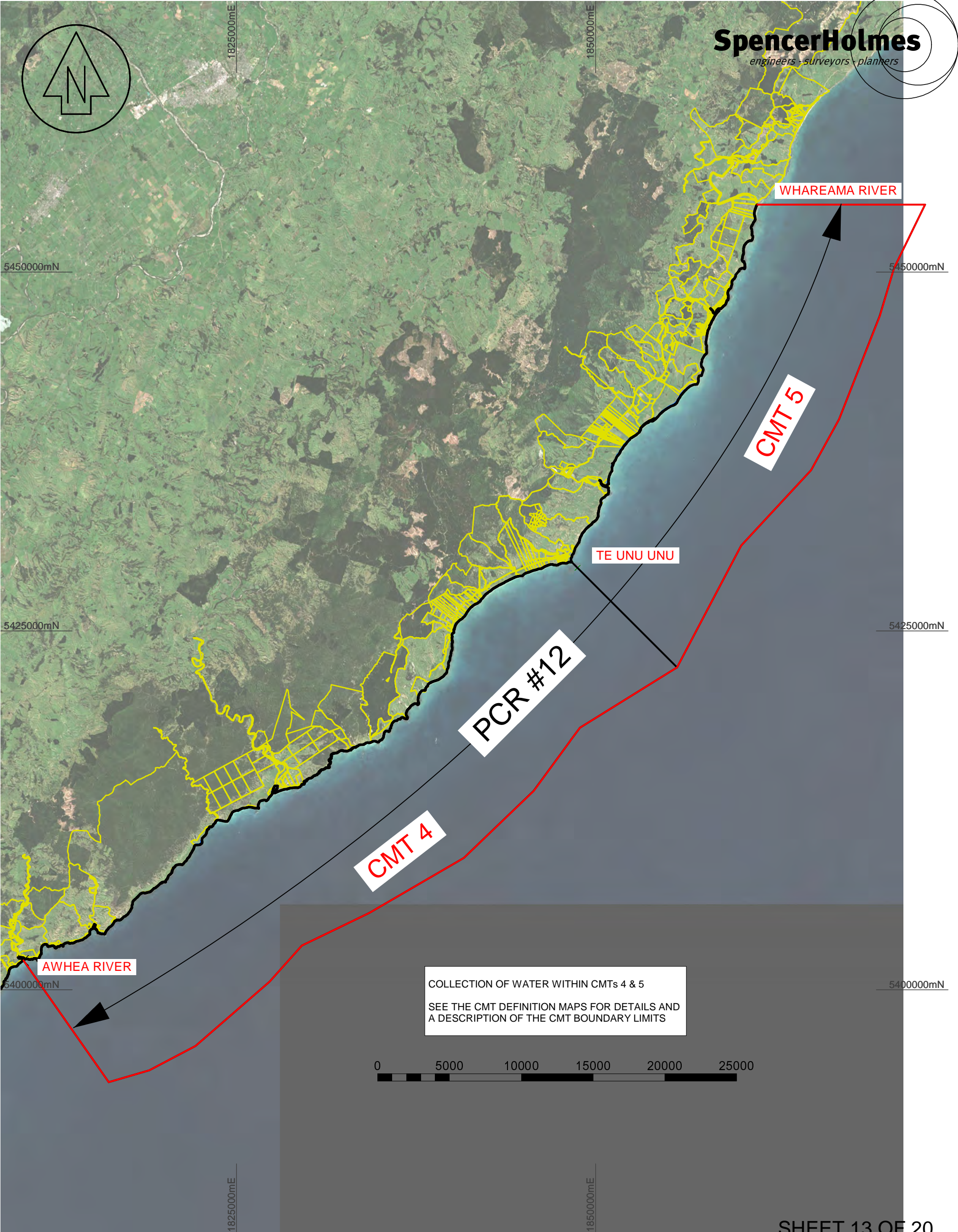


USE OF THE MARAMATAKA WITHIN CMTs 4 & 5

Proviso

Nothing in these restrictions is intended to prevent fishing vessels from launching and landing their vessels, provided this is done in a manner that is respectful of the wāhi tapu and minimises the disturbance to the physical environment, and that commercial vessels will follow the established industry code of practice in respect of preventing any fuel or oil spills.

Definition:

- The reference to “**taonga**” and “**natural materials**” does not include any fish, aquatic life or seaweed, the taking of which is regulated by the Fisheries Act 1996.
- The reference to “**the agreed Protocol**” means the written Protocol agreed by the order holders for Ngāti Hinewaka and Ngāi Tūmapūhia and the Seafood Industry representatives at the time of the making of this Order (or are varied from time to time with the written agreement of both).

Exclusions

To avoid doubt, these conditions do not prevent:

1. Greater Wellington Regional Council from carrying out its statutory functions (such as environmental monitoring, compliance and enforcement, flood protection, catchment management, pest management and maritime safety) in accordance with relevant legislation such as the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA), Local Government Act 2002, Biosecurity Act 1993, Maritime Transport Act 1994, or Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967. Before carrying out any of these functions in a wāhi tapu area or wāhi tapu area, the Council will provide prior notice to the order holder and will, subsequent to carrying out the activity, provide a report to the order holder. If requested by the order holder, the Council will also discuss with the order holder whether any cultural support or advice is necessary to support the safe delivery of these functions. To avoid doubt, this exclusion does not limit or otherwise affect the operation of the RMA permission right as provided for under the Takutai Moana Act; or
2. In addition, and without limitation to the above condition, a person from carrying out an activity contrary to the wāhi tapu conditions, if that person has beforehand sought and obtained the permission of the order holder.

Advice note:

In accordance with section 81(4) of the Takutai Moana Act it is not an offence for a person to do anything inconsistent with these conditions if:

- the person is carrying out an emergency activity as defined by section 63 of the Takutai Moana Act; or
- they are carrying out any of the PCR activities listed in Appendix D below.

ANNEXURE B — RĀHUI PROTOCOL

Relating to imposition of rāhui within the wāhi tapu area protection areas recognised under the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011

- 1 The terms of the agreed Protocol between the applicant groups and the Seafood Industry representatives relating to imposition of a rāhui within any of the wāhi tapu area protection areas recognised by the High Court under the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011, are as follows:
 - 1.1 In order to ensure timely and efficient communication between the hapū and the Seafood Industry, each will nominate a representative through whom communications will pass (including the relevant telephone numbers and email addresses).
 - 1.2 In the event the hapū proposes to establish a rāhui that might affect fishing, the hapū representative will promptly advise the Seafood Industry's representative of the:
 - (a) wāhi tapu area (or part area if appropriate) subject to the rāhui;
 - (b) nature of the proposed restrictions within that area; and
 - (c) the intended duration of the rāhui.
 - 1.3 Seafood Industry undertakes to actively manage any reported infringements of rāhui and report them to the hapū.
 - 1.4 During the time the rāhui remains in force, the hapū and Seafood Industry representatives will communicate periodically to discuss whether any modifications are necessary or appropriate in terms of the rāhui, including its duration and when the rāhui should be lifted.
- 2 The terms of this protocol may be amended at any time by written agreement between the applicant groups (or the relevant CMT rights holder) and the Seafood Industry representatives.
