PUBLIC ACCESS:

Under the current Court of Appeal COVID Protocol you must not enter the Court Building if you are:

- showing signs of illness;
- have tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 7 days.

If you have any symptoms of COVID-19, however minor, you must take a Rapid Antigen test (RAT) before attending a Court of Appeal hearing:

- a) If you test negative, and the symptoms are very minor (e.g., a scratchy throat), you may attend court but must wear a mask at all times.
- b) If you test negative and the symptoms are more severe (e.g., runny nose, coughing) you must not attend court unless a judge directs. If you are permitted to attend court, you must wear a mask at all times.
- c) <u>If you test positive you must not attend court.</u>

All persons in the Court building (including courtrooms) are $\underline{\text{encouraged}}$ to wear a KN95 (or equivalent) or surgical mask.
