MINUTE (NO. 3) OF CHURCHMAN J

[1] By minute dated 10 February 2020, the Court set a timetable for the filing and exchange of evidence in this matter which is scheduled to commence a four-week hearing before Mallon J on 2 November 2020.

[2] By a joint memorandum of counsel dated 1 May 2020, counsel for all the overlapping parties sought to vary the timetable directions set out in the minute of 10 February 2020.

[3] The minute explained that the consequences of the COVID-19 lockdown at Level 4 had severely hampered finalisation of evidence.

[4] I am satisfied that appropriate grounds exist for the proposed variation to the timetable. I note that Mr Melvin, for the Attorney-General, supports the proposed variation.

[5] Accordingly, the timetable is varied as follows:

- (a) the parties have until **15 May 2020** to file a memorandum with their submissions regarding the appointment of a pukenga;
- (b) the time for the filing of evidence in the response to the Clarkson evidence is now **1 June 2020**; and
- (c) the time for taking any other step in the proceeding is also extended by one month (with the exception that the fixture date of 2 November 2020 remains).

[6] Counsel are reminded that any further slippage in the timetable may jeopardise the fixture and are encouraged to use their best efforts to comply with this amended timetable.
