JUDGMENT OF THE COURT

- A An extension of time to apply for leave to appeal is granted.
- B Leave to appeal is granted (*Regan v Brougham* [2019] NZCA 401).
- C The approved ground is whether the Court of Appeal was right to allow the appeal to that Court.

REASONS

[1] We are satisfied that an extension of time to apply for leave to appeal should be granted, despite the opposition of the first respondent. The application was filed only a few days after the expiry of the appeal period and it is clear that there has been no prejudice to the respondents as a result of the short delay.
