JUDGMENT OF THE COURT

- A The application for extension of time for leave to appeal against *Cridge v Studorp Ltd* [2023] NZCA 365 is granted.
- B Any application must be filed on or before 20 working days after the Court of Appeal's judgment on the substantive appeal.

REASONS

[1] On 14 August 2023 the Court of Appeal dismissed the applicants' application

to adduce further evidence. Brief reasons were given but the Court indicated that fuller

reasons would be included in the judgment on the substantive appeal.¹

[2] The applicants seek an extension of time to apply for leave to appeal against

this judgment until 20 working days after the Court of Appeal's judgment on the

substantive appeal is delivered.

[3] The extension is sought because, in the event that the substantive appeal is

dismissed and leave is sought to appeal against that judgment, it may be necessary also

to seek leave to challenge the dismissal of the application to adduce further evidence.

[4] We are told that the respondents agree to the extension of time, without

prejudice to their position on any leave application and on any subsequent appeal.

[5] In those circumstances, the application for an extension of time to apply for

leave to appeal is granted. Any application must be filed on or before 20 working days

after the Court of Appeal's judgment on the substantive appeal.
